Nowell Berreth will discuss *Dart Cherokee Basin Operating Co., LLC v. Owens*, which makes it easier for corporate defendants to remove cases from state court to federal court. In *Dart*, the Supreme Court clarified that a defendant seeking removal to federal court need not include evidence of federal jurisdiction in its notice of removal; allegations of federal jurisdiction suffice. The Court also rejected the so-called "presumption" against removing cases to federal court under the Class Action Fairness Act.

In-House Counsel

In-house counsel are eligible for free registration to DRI seminars. In-house counsel are defined as licensed attorneys, who are employed exclusively by a corporation or other private sector organization for the purpose of providing legal representation and counsel only to that corporation, its affiliates and subsidiaries.
